Face Coverings If you feel comfortable and you do not have customers in store, you may remove your face covering. Once a customer(s) enters the store and they or a member of their group is wearing a face covering, staff should follow suit and wear a face covering until it is agreed with the customer(s) that it may be removed. Store Managers have the right to ask colleagues to wear a face covering in their store e.g. delivery drivers/assistants, engineers etc. If a person becomes ill in a shared space, these should be cleaned using disposable cloths and household detergents, according to current recommended workplace legislation and practice. 			Employees who fall into the vulnerable, clinically vulnerable and clinically extremely vulnerable categories will be assessed and provisions made accordingly. The Company recommends that you maintain one to two-metre social distancing, including while arriving at and departing from work and while in work.	
			In an emergency, for example an accident or fire, people do not have to stay one to two metres apart if it would be unsafe.
